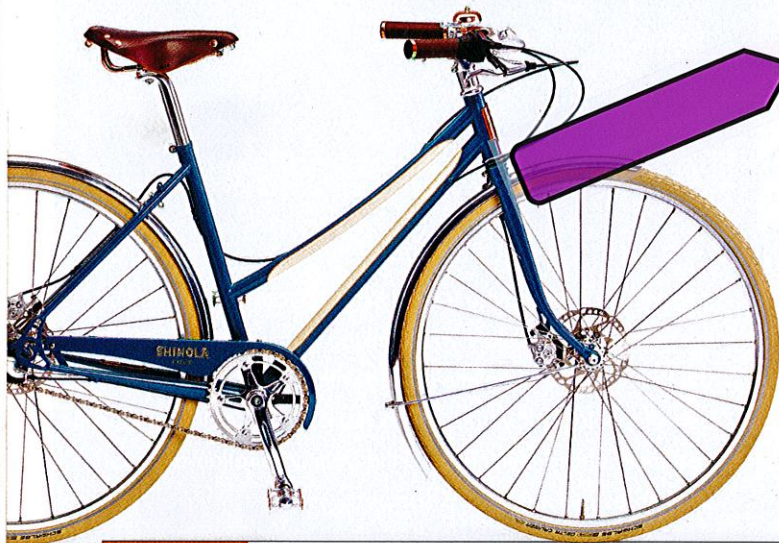

Forbidden Fruit

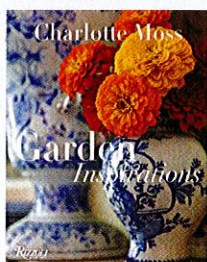

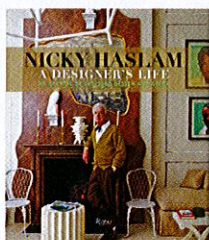
| Virginia White

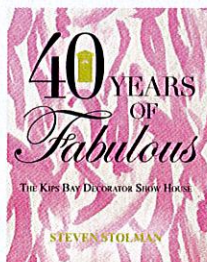

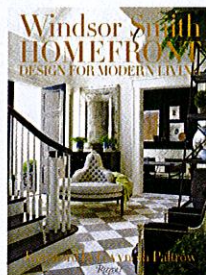

**Nicky Haslam: A Designer's Life**

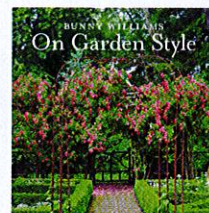

**Forty Years of Fabulous: The Kips Bay Decorator Show House**

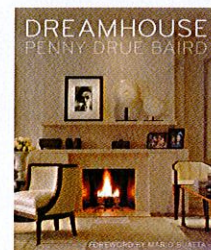
