2014 has been an incredible year for COCOON, my ongoing public space sculpture. Its latest iteration, in Paris's Goutte d'Or neighborhood, was part of the annual Nuit Blanche, the city's celebrated dusk-to-dawn arts festival. And there was an exhibition of Eric Etheridge's COCOON photography, more than 300 portraits of participants, at Echomusée during September and October.

Our fundraising efforts in the US included a benefit in New York City and our first Kickstarter campaign. On Thursday, February 19, we will celebrate the successful completion of COCOON Goutte d'Or with a party in New York City. Invitations will be sent after the New Year.

COCOON Goutte d'Or PARIS

Goutte d'Or, a largely immigrant neighborhood in Paris's 18th Arrondissement, was the site of public sculpture number four in the ongoing COCOON series. This iteration was developed over two years, beginning in the Goutte d'Or in 2012. It culminated in a procession, *When Skin Walks with Memory*, that started on the train platform at Charles de Gaulle airport and ended with the illumination of the COCOON sculpture in Square Léon on October 4, 2014, as part of the citywide Nuit Blanche festival. The sculpture was lined with more than 400 symbolic objects created by local people; their recorded anonymous testimonies were broadcast inside. During the two days that the illuminated structure remained up in Goutte d'Or, 2,000 people walked through it.

GFR - le Collectif


