#### 4 Visual Code

Influenced by today's digitized world, this collection of dynamic carpet tiles by David Oakey Designs translates technical glitches and circuit boards into high-texture flooring. Ten patterns in 44 vibrant hues are included. Shown is Circuit Board in red.

**Materials** Recycled nylon

**Dimensions** 25 cm x 1 m plank

#### 5 Dichroic

The rectangular and angular shapes of this series can be configured to create wayfinding and distinct zones within a commercial space. Striped patterns fade in and out for an ombré effect in up to 12 colours.

**Materials** Post-consumer PET fibre

#### 6 The Moiré Collection

Installation artist Gabriel Dawe created this full-spectrum flooring, which, as its name implies, incorporates rippled textures and vibrant plays of light. The line consists of three patterns in multiple tonal ranges.
